## Memorial and Thank-Offering Flowers

Each Sunday the Chancel Guild places flowers at the front of the church, which adds to the beauty of our services. The cost of the flowers is covered by donations from our congregation and a dedication concerning the flowers is included in the service leaflet. In 2017 over 70 dedications were recorded. The flowers are generally donated as memorial offerings in memory of loved ones or as a thank-offering to celebrate a special occasion, such as a wedding, anniversary, baptism, graduation, etc. The flowers are then delivered to members of the parish after the service, such as shut-ins, ill parishioners and those people celebrating a special occasion.

## “ASK Cares” Role Descriptions

### WHAT IS AN ‘ASK CARES’ PROGRAM?

The goal of this program is to develop, create, and support a group of volunteers who will provide practical and supportive care for individuals and families facing a challenging time. This would include parishioners and their family members who have to cope with different issues; such as facing serious illness, parishioners undergoing medical procedures, those coping with loss, or maybe coping with a loved one who is hospitalized, possibly to a new family who are adjusting to the birth of a baby.

A parishioner in need can be identified through the clergy or any member of the congregation. Once identified, and with the permission of the parishioner in need, Deacon Jennifer will contact the individual/family to assess what type of help could best suit their needs.

## **WHAT WILL BE MY ROLE AS A COORDINATOR OR VOLUNTEER WITH THE 'ASK CARES' PROGRAM?**

**COORDINATORS:** As a coordinator you will be contacted by Deacon Jennifer with the parishioner's permission and provided with information about the needs for support for the individual/family.

The coordinator will be provided with the list of volunteer's names, their contact information and what they are able to help out with e.g. a meal or drives.

The coordinator will then contact the parishioner in need to plan a schedule of what type of help is needed on which day and contact the volunteers to communicate the plan for assistance. E.g. on which day is a drive of meal required.

The coordinator will keep in touch with the parishioner to update and change the scheduling of volunteers as needed.

**VOLUNTEERS:** As a volunteer you will decide what type of assistance you can provide the parishioner/family, including:

- Providing a meal
- Driving to appointments
- Doing small grocery shopping
- Provide companionship or give a family member some support to allow them to take a break from caregiving demands.
- Doing small errands
- Driving a parishioner to do small errands
- Reading to a parishioner
- Time commitments for both Coordinators and Volunteers would be infrequent on an as-needed basis.

## **ASK Sponsorship of Refugees**

## Cards for PAR Users

An increasing number of parishioners are using PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance), which is a monthly automatic withdrawal from your bank. It is a great way to support the church as your offering is received whether you are in church, on vacation or just having a day of rest. By using this method, parishioners do not need to use envelopes on Sunday. Some people have indicated they want to put something on the offertory plate. Now you can. We are providing re-useable business cards (available in the narthex or at the south-east sanctuary entrance) in a well-marked box.

Once you have placed a card on the collection plate, it will be returned to the box for further use.
